

### Traffic in the closed areas in the Port of Esbjerg

The International Ship and Port Facility Security Code (the ISPS Code) applies to the facilities of the Port of Esbjerg (protection of shipping against terrorism).

In consequence hereof, the Port of Esbjerg has launched below security measures:

# Admittance control (gates, fences, manned/unmanned admittance control)

- The purpose is to secure against illegal traffic. Legal traffic is conditional upon legitimate business in the secured areas.

# Monitoring of the areas (CCTV/individuals)

- The purpose is to secure against illegal traffic and to detect security threats.

# **Response against security threats**

- Security threats must be stopped.

In addition to the abovementioned measures Port of Esbjerg needs **your** assistance in order to maintain security in the secured areas. We therefore ask you to pay attention to the things that happen around you when you are in or close to the secured areas.

Port Control is open 24/7, and all tips will be taken seriously.

#### Below incidents could be security related

- Photography/video recording that seems suspicious
- Illegal forcing of gates or fences
- Collection of information that seems suspicious
- Individuals without legitimate business in the secured areas

Most likely, other incidents than the ones stated above could be security related. And this is where we are dependent on you who frequently visits the secured areas. We believe that your observations are important.
